Colonel's Column


Well, Smoke N Fire and Ambush X are over for another year so I will be getting my wife back. I believe it was one of our best annual shoots thanks to the planning and hard work of the various committees and the attendance of the cowboy community at large, a hearty thank you for your participation.

The annual event is tailored each year to meet the changing tastes in Cowboy Action Shooters as well as the changing economic situation. Plans are already being made for next year's event.

This month I want to discuss membership in RJSS specifically. Many folks asked over the annual event how they could become a member. The answer is simple, fill out an application (available on the RJSS website or from Mattie or in the registration area), pay your dues which are \$35.00 per individual or \$55.00 for a family membership (family being those living at one address) and give this to Mattie or the registration folks. You will be officially taken in as a member at the next RJSS business meeting but you are considered a member right away. Membership entitles you to a lower shooters fee in all RJSS matches. People are sometimes hesitant to join fearing we will ask something more of them. Let me lay this rumor to rest once and for all. By being a member and paying your dues on time (by January 31 each year) you have already done your part to keep RJSS alive and well. The shooting season is from April to October and pretty well cares for the costs during these months. However, from November to March we have no revenue generating events but continue to have rent, website, insurance, advertisement, and postage to pay. By being a member your dues carry the society through the winter. You have fully discharged your duties as a member of RJSS at this point.

The foregoing is not to say that we don't appreciate your help above and beyond paying your dues, just that we don't expect it. Many of our members live one hours driving time from the range or have a job situation that limits their ability to actually come to RJSS very often other than for shooting events. This is fine, as many of these folks put in hours on end producing stages, writing scenarios, being club officers, making props, securing sponsors all from their home via phone or computer. As a member you may be asked to do or help out with something. Take this as a compliment because apparently the person asking you feels you have something special to offer, but remember you can always say no. Currently, at this writing we have 96 members who have fulfilled their duty by paying their dues this year. Of that 96 about 25 come to RJSS for onsite projects sometime during the year with less than 10 handling the ongoing range upkeep.

We have revised our over the berm rule. From now on, any shot over the berm with a single projectile firearm is a match DQ. Any shot over the berm with a shotgun will be considered unsafe gun handling and will be a stage DQ, unless there is a special situation such as a clay bird that is designed to be shot at a high angle.

Something to think about, since this is an election year, Maybe some of you folks out there can Cowboy Up and run for office at RJSS. Even if you don't become an officer don't be afraid to step forward and join a committee, trust me, there is plenty to do and any help is appreciated. On a safety note: BE SAFE, I said so.
