
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Howdy Pards,

Deputy Keck has been checking with Allegheny Power about electricity for RJSS. Estimated cost above ground to the Registration building is \$10,500.00 and below ground \$12,500.00 which doesn't include the cost of digging the ditch or purchasing the flex line pipe or the monthly cost of power once we have it. We are also checking into the cost of a new standby generator. Power needs of the club will be evaluated by the electrical committee.


