


# **News from Tombstone**





### The Colonel's Column

First of all, thank you for wishing me well in my new office as Territorial Governor. I will be consulting with my fellow TG's Chicken Coop from McDonald and Deputy Keck of Logan's Ferry. In addition I have asked Vegas Kid to be my assistant in this office as he has had experience in these matters working with Fuzzy.

From a TG standpoint there is not much new to report. I have no word on when the pocket handbook for 2008 will be in general circulation but feel it will be sometime before End of Trail. Many of the changes for 2008 relate to the minimum power factor to be applied at state and above level shoots, illegal shotgun ammo and handling and movement of firearms.

One new item bears mention in particular and that is in the case of a firearms malfunction where live rounds are still in the firearm. An attempt should be made to unload first at the firing line, if this is not possible then attempt to unload at the unloading (or loading) table. If this is not possible without holding up the posse then a Match Official (at RJSS the Vice President or the Safety Officer) may move the firearm to the Firearms Handling Bay. I might add two people (one should be the owner of the gun) should be with the firearm at all times when trying to clear it just to keep each other safe.

Thanks to Dr. Mary Walker for briefing our posse leaders on the Medical Assistance Plan and Safety Evacuation Plan during the walk through. The Doctor and I are in the process of updating both plans. Walkie talkies and air horns will be replacing the whistles. You will see this year our emphasis will be on making RJSS as safe as possible through many different means. If you have a suggestion please let any member of the Executive Committee know.

### **Ambush Update**

The judging for the Costume Contest for Ambush X will be held all day long on Saturday July 19, 2008. Just come to the Short Twig Saloon anytime that day and give the judges your presentation. The categories will be as follows:

- 1. Working Cowboy
- 2. Working Cowgirl
- 3. Military
- 4. B western Men
- 5. B western Ladies
- 6. Working/Town Men
- 7. Working/Town Ladies
- 8. Couples
- 9. Lone Ranger

Each contestant will be given 60 seconds (90 seconds for couples) to present their costume. The presentation can be done "in character" or as an explanation as to how the costume was assembled. The presentation will count for 25% of the total score. The remaining 75% of the score will be equally divided between originality, authenticity, and detail. So you see how the average costume having been presented in a superior manner can win over a fantastic costume presented "well here I am".

A few words about the Lone Ranger category, this is a special category this year to go along with our 10<sup>th</sup> Ambush Theme. Don't be intimidated by this one, but have fun with it.
