Because we will not have a large enough order of these badges to receive a discount you can order any of the different color styles. Neil at StarPacker recommends the Gold Tone because the badge is solid in color so a scratch or nick will not show a different color underneath. Also the Two Tone will be the same but with nickel overlay at the names. Add \$6.00 for shipping. And I can order these at any time. These must be paid for before ordered.
