### **THE TOWN**

**The air- conditioners that Caption John Huston gave to the club for the saloon and the administration building really came in handy at the monthly Aug. match, as soon as I can get someone to help, I'll try and get the one that Chalk and Surly gave us, put up in the café. Thanks, Capt Huston and his wife and to Chalk and Surly, for keeping the town cool. Also, the pavilion that is going to come and replace that tent between the café and the courthouse will be up before the Sept. match. It is just like the other metal one only 20x21, after putting that tent up and taking it down, it'll be mighty nice.**

### **THE PARKING LOT**

**There have been six camper pads put in the parking lot, for shooters to use when they come to stay overnight. There were 4, set in on the left side going into the town and 2 on the right side.**

### **RANGE IMPROVEMENTS**

**It seems that range improvements is a never ending thing at RJSS, The berm between bay #9 and #10 was lengthen and make higher for better safety when shooting at those two bays, during matches. In bay #6 the saloon/hotel stage front has been started. The holes were drilled and the poles set, and now starts the real part, getting the building up. I got wood donated from some lumber mills around the area and some other businesses gave us some lumber also. But there are still some other things that the club needs to get, like nails, screws and roofing, would like to see this building done by the last match.**

**The club has had ten matches this year so far this year and at the beginning of the year Cutter brought to the first meeting in Jan. items that Fuzzy wanted to be given to the club to run on a tip board and the money made from that to be given for range improvements, I gave the club a picture of the Lone Ranger, signed by Clayton Moore, to be run on a tip board for a dollar a pull. Now Fuzzy's board still has 50 or more on it. The Lone Ranger board has all been sold. Flatrock won it. Now here's the real issue, the club has over 100 members and other people like to come to shoot, but nobody wants to support the club to improve it. The club needs funds to improve things to make shooting here more enjoyable, this cost money to do. Now here's the question, why would it take over ten matches to sell a hundred tips at a dollar a tip to a membership of over a 100. I took it to an IVCSA meeting one night a sold 25 tips and there only about 30 people there. So that means it took ten matches to find a winner. Support, where's it at. Another thing, 50/50 board, it takes the club all day to try and sell one board at \$2.00 a tip with 38 tips on a board. That's the winner getting \$38.00's the food pantry getting \$10.00, and the club keeps \$27.00. I keep work days down because people are bitching it cost them money to get to the club. How many people have to do anything at this club in help setting up or tearing down at a match or helping in any other way You don't do anything but show up shoot, and go home, where else do you get do that? So, why don't you buy two 50/50 tickets or get two or more chances on a tip board. If more people did this things would improve faster around the RJSS range. If I made some people mad, so be it. Go look in the mirror, and asked yourself what have I done to help make improvements at RJSS, physically or financially. To all the others that have helped me in the past, thank you for all the help, and you know who you are. If you don't help at your clubs, soon there won't be a place to shoot at and you can go set at the bar and cry in your 5.00 beer on what use to be the day you were a the range shooting.**
